Key steps to establish a country SAKSS

- 1. Capacity Needs Self-Assessment
- 2. Capacity Strengthening Strategy
- 3. Action Plan
- 4. ToRs and Work Plan
- 5. Sign agreement with ReSAKSS



Capacity Needs Assessment (CNA) Studies

- CNA studies completed for 14 countries
- The studies are published for 12 countries (5 countries in Eastern Africa, 2 countries in Southern Africa, 5 countries in Western Africa)





Progress in establishing country SAKSS

Agreements signed:

 DRC, Ghana, Mozambique, Rwanda, Togo, Tanzania

Agreements ready for signature:

Benin, Burkina and Ethiopia

To be signed by end of 2014:

Uganda, Kenya, Senegal



Experiences and lessons learned

Country political buy-in and leadership are very important

 Technical buy in and leadership of the Ministry of agriculture are equally important in successful establishment of country SAKSS

 Mutual trust between country and ReSAKSS creates confidence but takes time to build

Future plans

- Establishment and Consolidation of Country SAKSS
- Support For Review and Mutual Accountability Processes
 - ➤ Publication of national versions of the Annual Trends and Outlook Reports (ATOR)
 - ➤ Informing and guiding agriculture Joint Sector Reviews (JSRs)
- Knowledge management and capacity building
 - ➤ Data, Analysis, Communication, and Policy Dialogue Tools: eAtlas; Food Security Portal
 - Capacity Strengthening: Data Construction and Economic Modeling Tools: SAM, CGE, ECOSIM
